Project Description Purpose of the Museum

The Busan International Architectural Competition Organizing Committee, whi ch is a part of the Busan International Architectural Culture Festival under the auspices of the UIA organizes the 3rd International Architectural Competition on the topic of Ecological Center which will be place at the Nakdong River Ar ea in Busan.

The 'Eco-center' is to serve as a central place for the natural reservation and ecological education in the southern part of South Korea. The Eco-center will show how human being can live harmoniously with natural environment. At the same time, this facility will be a place that shows the past, the present and the future ecological situation of the Nakdong River area. To educate people regarding the relationships between the living things and the lifeless things and the relationships between human being and natural environment by displaying the objects around site area. In this context, with this facility will play a central role as an educational institution which shows that the heavily developed natural environment will cause a critical disaster for both human being and the nature. At the same time, this facility will show how people and nature can co-exist with harmony. Thus, the building has to have the issue of co-existence of the human being and the nature with positive futuristic vision.

Anonymity

- In order to ensure anonymity, all drawings and the cover page of Design Descriptions will be marked with the Personal Identification Number (PIN) consisting of one(1) alphabet and four(4) numeral of the competitor's choice at the top right and corner within a rectangle of 50mm x 100mm (confer the 'PIN.dwg' from the competition material). Once received by the Professional Advisor's staff, the rectangle will be covered with opaque paper and a random Identification (ID) will be assigned.

Anonymity of submitted materials will be maintained until the final decision of the Jury.

Each competitor is required to pack all materials in white wrapping paper, attach a sealed white letter-size envelope clearly marked with the PIN number containing the Identification Form of the PIN user, and cover the entire package with material suitable for mailing or transporting by courier services. Upon receipt by the Professional Advisor's office, the outer cover will be removed and destroyed.

Specific Instructions for Submission Materials

All materials are on white paper. The Plans, Elevations and Sections should be shown at the scale of **1:1/200** the Site Plan at **1:1/500** with north direction clearly indicated. Except for the perspective panel, using color is permitted on drawings. Name areas of spaces are directly shown on drawings. The metric system will be used.

Architectural Design and Exhibition Plan panels consist of five (3) A2 size mounted on foam boards. Architectural Design panels shall include, but not limited to the site plan, plans of all levels, longitudinal and transverse sections, and two (2) elevations, Exhibition Plan panel(s) shall include exhibition concept, plans with circulation, method/schemes of display. A competitor may specify the arrangement of five (3) panels.

Perspective (Bird's Eye View) is on white ground, A2 size horizontal, mounted on foam board. Use of color is acceptable.

Design Description will form an essential component for judging as it is an important means of interfacing the architect and the Eco-center. It will combine texts and diagrams/drawings clearly presented on white A4 or letter size paper, 12 pages or less, bound on the left.

The Design Description shall include the following:

Area Tabulation showing Space Program requirement vs. Actual Area
Site/Environmental Analysis
Architectural Design Concept
Exhibition Plan
Guiding principle

Design Description may include design intentions of the competitor otherwise not expressed on panels.

CD-Rom of all contents for use in future publication

Each competitor is advised to state "No Commercial Value" on the customs declaration in order not to incur customs duties and unforeseen delays at the customs upon arrival in Korea. A competitor, however, is free to purchase an insurance coverage adequate to provide protection against loss or damage independent of the customs declaration.

The winning entries will also be published by the UIA in its Newsletter and on the web site.

All entries presented to the jury will be exhibited to the public for 2 weeks after the jury meeting. The jury report is available during the exhibition.
