The project employs traditional construction methods from the region, offering a simple yet effective architectural solution that integrates seamlessly into the local context with minimal resources.

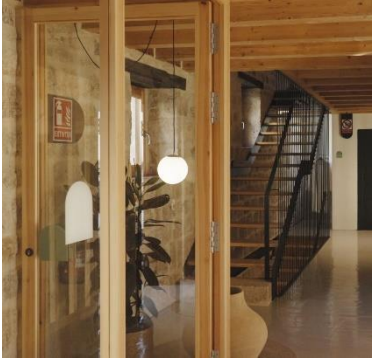

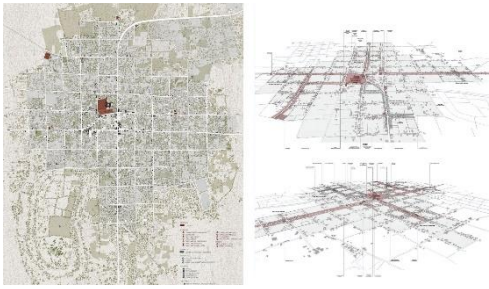

A restoration project creating a welcoming urban space, using native cherry trees and local schist paving.

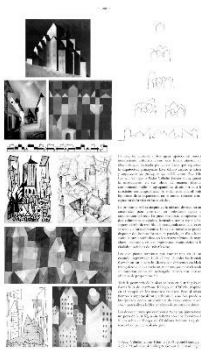

A community-focused senior facility, prioritizing accessibility, comfort, and social integration.



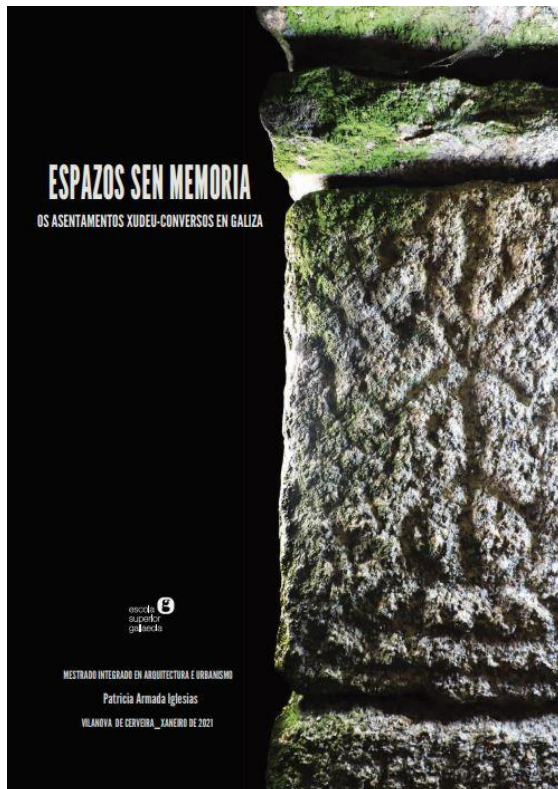

Research on the heritage of cave dwellings in the Vinalopó Medio region, aiming to raise awareness and propose conservation strategies for these unique structures.

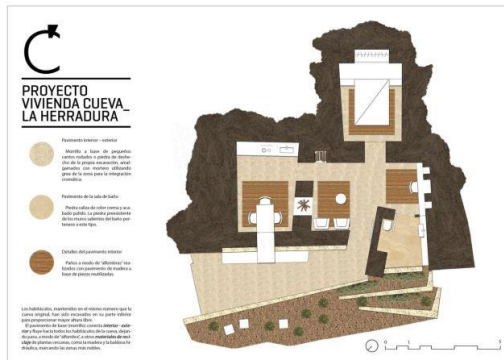


Figura 432. Casa 1. Lámina 3: Planta

A skatepark design that integrates trees within a continuous loop, blending the environment with the skatepark's design.

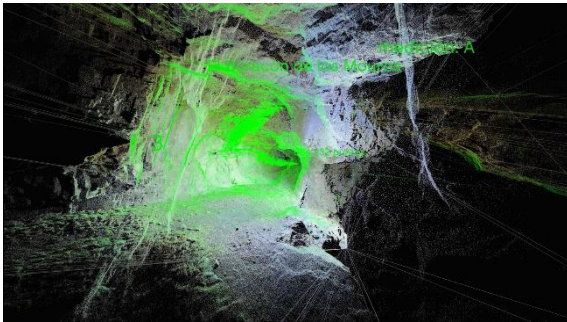
